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Torquay

On Friday 8th March, the Band hit the A303 for the annual trek to Torquay for the 2013 Regional Brass Band Finals. An excellent rehearsal in the evening was followed by a brief sojourn to the hotel bar and an early night. The following morning was leisurely for a change, as we knew we were in the 2nd half of the draw. After another good rehearsal we



made our way over to the Riviera Centre. The usual signing on and waiting rituals were followed and then we were on stage. A great start built in a glorious whole band sound and we were on our way. The music flowed and everyone did their bit! We knew we'd played well when we heard the last note of the piece ring out across the (notoriously dead-sounding) auditorium. As we played so late, there was no long agonising wait for the results. We were soon into the

adjudicators' summing-up and then the nerve-wracking reverse-order of results from 6th to 1st. By the time the adjudicator had reached 2nd you could feel the tension, but when he announced that we were placed 2nd, the tension was broken by the loudest cheer of the weekend. Not only had we qualified for the National Finals for the second time ever (and in a row) but had been promoted to the 3rd section for the first time in the band's history. The band meal that night was a sober affair. Actually, that's not quite correct! With plenty of beer and wine and Jon Chalk handing out fines, the evening went off splendidly. Well done all – the results are a testament to the players' commitment to improving and to Colin's leadership with the baton. With last year's experience behind us, and a still-improving band, who knows what awaits us at Cheltenham in the autumn!

Colin said that his primary aim when he started was to get to the Third Section, which we had now achieved, and we now as a band need to work together and decide where we want to go. He said that last year had been a good year and congratulated everyone for their efforts.
